Class sizes and constitution were not a problem due to the fact that we were fortunate enough to have maintained a quota of four teachers over the Year 7 - Year 12 spectrum. The senior classes have grown considerably in size, making the teaching of these groups a challenge. The enrolment into Year 7 was a disappointment in 1987. We need to bear in mind, that this low enrolment will create repercussions for future years. I see an urgent need to implement a renewed recruitment program. The life of our Slovenian Classes depends on it.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank each and all of the teachers for their commitment and professional attitude to their work.

I would like to voice my gratitude, on the committee's behalf, of the dependability of our relief teachers, who have on many occasions come to our aid.

The Higher School Certificate Candidates Ball was once again a successful and memorable occasion. Feedback indicates the event did much to unite Slovenians and publicise the work of this committee.

Discussions on the possibility of Slovenian becoming an elective subject at Macquarie University continue. Although the outlook at times seemed dim, the investigations into prospects never stopped.

Once again, thank you to all those who contributed to the success of our ventures in 1986/87.

The Concept of the Lecturate
The committee for the establishment of a Slovenian Lectorate

University. Correspondance is on record between the committee,
the University and Senator Lajovic. In 1986 the idea was revived
when Prof Krek offered a proposal regarding such a lectorate to

Development and Education. Dr. Boris Frlec personally endorsed
the matter. Later, in 1987 a grant was provided for a teacher in
Argentina. In 1988 the annual grant was extended to Australia,
to the value of one lecturer's salary. The Faculty of Philosophy
also lended its support to the Australian program.

Other centres of Slovenian studies include: New York University, Kansas City and Columbia University, Nottingham University (U.K.), Paris, Leipzig and Graz Universities. A school of Slovenian studies also exists at Trieste University.

The most important thought behind the lecturates is that they foster the Slovenian language, both as a means of communication and identification. In Australia, the idea of national identification is seen as being more important.

It was proposed that the sub-committee meets within 14 days for further detailed discussions. Mr. I. Kobal and Mrs. O. Lah joined the sub-committee.

MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY

REPORT OF A MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 8TH OCTOBER 1987 TO DISCUSS

THE POSSIBLE INTRODUCTION OF SLOVENIAN STUDIES AT MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY

On Thursday 8th October Macquarie University was pleased to receive a delegation to discuss the possible introduction of Slovenian Studies within the School of Modern Languages' Slavonic program. The delegation consisted of Mr Gianfranco Cresciani (Senior Project Officer, Ethnic Affairs Commission of New South Wales), Mr Leon Krek (Chairperson, Slovenian Lectorate Committee), Mr Vladimir Menard (President, Slovenian Academic Club) and Mrs Marisa Lican (Translator, Ethnic Affairs Commission of New South Wales).

The University was represented by Professor Di Yerbury (Vice-Chancellor), Professor Keith Goesch (Professor of French and Head of the School of Modern Languages) and Dr Thaddeus Gasinski (Senior Lecturer in charge of Slavonic Studies).


The delegation informed the University representatives that the Slovenian Government had agreed to meet half the cost of establishing a position of Lecturer in Slovenian Studies, and suggested that the additional funds required could be provided by the local Slovenian community.

The delegation was advised that the cost of such a proposal would be of the order of \$80,000 - \$100,000 in the first year, increasing in the second and third years as more advanced courses were added to the program.

It was recommended that a Slovenian Studies Foundation be established in the first instance similar to those already in existence for Ukrainian, Croatian, Polish and Serbian. Its function would be to raise the necessary funds and to serve as a formal link between the community and the University.

It was agreed that a further meeting should be held when the Ambassador for Yugoslavia returned to Australia next month, which would also be attended by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Barry Leal, and the University's Legal Officer, Mrs Pamela Green.

The University representatives present at this first meeting were all of the opinion that Slovenian Studies would be a welcome addition to the School's Slavonic offering and expressed the hope that the necessary funding could be found to make this possible as a long-term project as well as one for the immediate future.

Lican reported that the Bankstown School has written to all Consulates of ethnic group languages tought at Bankstown requesting a book donation for each Higher School Certificate (HSC) student Candidate. Mrs Lican showed an illustrated book in English entitled "Belgrade From Above" donated by Kompa The general consesus was that both the content and language of the book was not suitable as a gift for this occasion. In the meantime, Mrs Lican reported that the Consul General has arranged for a search to be made for a book that may be more suitable and that he would consult with Mrs Lican in this regard. It was agreed that Mrs Lican would make a selection of what would be available on the behalf of the SSC. Mrs Lican will also inform Kompa of the SSC decision about the abovementioned book.

Teachers Reports: There were no significant matters to report except that Mrs Lican was approached by a student at Condell Park Girls High School for help in resolving a perceived anomaly in that it was a requirement of that school for students taking a foreign language as a subject, to take up two additional study units than was previously required, putting such students at a disadvantage. Prof. L. Krek undertook to raise this matter with Mr Dooley. It was reportd that similar difficulties had been experienced at Chester Hill several years ago but had been satisfactorily resolved.

Mrs Susnik handed \$56 being proceeds from the sale of two of

each Manuals 1 and 2.

Membership: Mr Kobal handed a cheque for \$150 on behalf of the Slovene National Association. Subsequent to the meeting Mr Samsa handed a cheque for \$150 on behalf of the Slovene Graduates Association. Mr Samsa will hand all the money received to the Treasurer Mr Ferfolja.

HSC Ball: The HSC Ball will be held in the premises of Triglav Club on Saturday 28th November 1987. Mrs Lican reported that none of the official Guests invited had made a reply.

It was agreed that, as in the past Mrs Lican will compile a programme of ceremonies in conjunction with Miss Liza Reja-Wolfand

Fr Jenko advised that Fr Bozic had the printing of the admission tickets in hand.

Mr Peter Krope requested that he be informed as soon as practicable of any firm reservations from Associations or individuals. Mr Krope will also arrange for the preparation of the stage and for the purchase of flowers

Mr Kozelj will ask Mr Rebernik to take a Video recording of the ceremony as well as a number of specific photos for the SSC records.

Other Business: Prof. Krek reported that good progress was made during a meeting of a delegation led by Prof. Krek with representatives of McQuarrie University in obtaining agreement from McQuarrie University on the introduction of Slovenian Studies into the University's School of Slavonik languages starting in 1989. The initial cost of establishing the Slovenian Lectorate was estimated to be \$80,000 to \$100,000 per year of which half would be provided by the Slovenian Government and there were good prospect of receiving grants from the Government of N.S.W. for about a quarter of the required amount. The remainder will have to be collected by the local Slovene Community. For this purpose and for forming a link between the Community and the University it was proposed a Slovenian Studies Foundation be established, which would include a number of distinguished local Slovenes. In order to broaden the base of the Foundation it was proposed that representatives of the Blovenian Organizations be also included in the Foundation. Agreement for this proposal will be sought from the individual Organizations.

Prof. Krek stressed the need for an immediate decision on the acceptance of the University's offer, which has to be conveyed to the University before Christmas.

Mr Krope moved that a gift of \$200 be made to Sister Hilarja, as in the past, for the catering at the meetings of the SSC. The motiom was seconded by Mr Sernek. The motion was carried.

The meeting closed at 11:00pm.

It was proposed that the "Association of Slovene Organisations" organise a meeting of all Slovene organisation to discuss the matter. Progress on the issue is to be published in "Novo Doba". All organisations are to nominate their representative by the 10th of March, 1988.

Following the questions by the two guests on the working of the committee and the member organisations, a lively discussion developed.
