



- -Representation outside of Institution e.g. cultural and sporting
- -Community service and/or involvement

Secondary Student

- -Academic record (most current results) with sound, consistent results across all subjects (end of year report 2003 accepted)
- -School representation and/or participation e.g. extra duties, prefect or captain, sporting, voluntary work for charities or at school, drama, music or any other extra-curricular activities
- -Community Service and/or involvement e.g. sporting, volunteer work, charity work; through church or other, cultural.

Primary Student

- -Sound performance at school based on reports (most current); high level of consistency.
- -Effort at school based on report comments; high level of consistency
- -School representation and/or extra-curricular activities at school or in the community e.g. class captains, volunteering/helping, music, drama, sport
