I was born Erika Zohar on 6/5/1945 in Dolic Prekmurje to mother Rozalija Zohar and father Alojz Kucan.

By this time my father was already serving in the army.

I lived with my grandparents Maria and Joze Zohar on the farm till my mother and father got married in Maribor on 19th February 1949 then I came to live with them.

When I was seven years old I got my first small piano accordian and was enroled in music school. Eventually I got a 120 bass white accordian and joined the Maribor orchestra as an accordian member. When I

was 11 years old we were invited to perform in Belgrade for Marshall Tito's birthday by youth of Yugoslavia. I was one of the lucky ones that was also selected to visit the private zoo of Tito and this is when I saw my first live elephant.

In my first highschool year I was excelling in 800m sprints and my parents were asked if I could attend a special school for sport gifted children, so I could be trained in 800m and 1500m but my parents decided to escape Yugoslavia after I finished school.

On 7th July 1957 we escaped to Austria, and were chosing whether to imigrate to Canada or Germany. At that time the borders were closed to immigrants and it was at that time we decided to imigrate to Australia instead (the lucky country)!!! At Jannesdorf camp we met up with 2 other families Feri and Teresa Matus and Janez, Irinka with daugther Marijana Flisar, they arrived on 14th July 1957 and we became friends and stay that way till this day.

In Austria my parents bought a small accordian for me as everything was left behind. We travelled by tain to Triest were we boarded the ship "Aurelia". Onboard when I was't sick of the high seas or tonsilitis I entertained Staff and Passengers alike with my lively tunes from our home country. We arrived in Fremantle, Australia on 2nd November 1957 after 30 days at sea, then continued onto Melbourne where we were sent to the Bonegilla Migrant camp and we spent our first Christmas in very hot Australia which was difficult to aclimatise to. We were then sent to Wollongong NSW by train to the Fairy Meadows hostel. My father got a job at the Port Kembla steelworks and we moved to a single room in a shared house in Cringilla. As my mother couldn't get a job we had to relocate back to Wollongong. At the time that I turned 13, my parents decided to move to Sydney as there were more opportunities for jobs.

We moved to Pitt St, Redfern and I was enrolled in St.Patrick School for girls in Redfern. The school was run by a group of nuns where Sister Maria kindly took me under her wings and gave me extra lessons in English. After approximately 2 years I was taught how to take shorthand/dictation and typing lessons as the Sister knew I wasn't interested in finishing highschool as I was already 15 and was just finishing year 7.

While I was still at school I had job working every night in the Rachel Foster Hospital from 5.30pm to 7.30pm where I would wipe dishes and earn 9 pounds 60 shilling a fortnight. The three of us lived in one large room where we had a small stove for cooking but had to share the bathroom with all the other tennants. We lived on 5 pounds a week and saved all the money to buy a house, my mother also worked as cleaner at the same hospital and my father got a job at a brewery in Redfern.

It was during this time that we came across a piano accordian teacher Mr Otto Weiss who took me in and started to teach me. Later on he helped me buy a brand new Hohner electronic piano accordian from Germany for 125 pounds. Under his guideance and tuition I was then asked to join his orchestra as the accordian player where we entertained many audiences and attended various venues such as being guests on the Bobby Limb show on tv.

It was in 1960 We bought a house at Kepos street Redfern with our friend Teresa and Feri Matus who we met in Austria. At this house we had lots of different families boarding with us at the same time. During this period we had lots of parties and celebrations where we entertined in a true European style.

It was at this location where by chance we got to know Mr. Urbancic who had an unfortunate accident close by and somehow stumbled upon our house. It was during this time that we all realised that he was Slovenian like us (he was probably drawn to the location by the smell of homemade moonshine.!!!).

He let us know that he was interested in establishing a communal place for Slovenians for gatherings and celebrations and was collecting money in order to to buy a place.

Slovenian masses at the time were held at the St. Patrick Church in the City, were Father Odilo asked me to accompany the choir with my accordian as they didn't have a organ. Together with Father Bernard they proceeded to start a musical group in Woollahra were

I was also asked to attend. It was at this time that the first Slovenian music group was established for the Slovenian community were we held traditional dances and concerts for everyone to enjoy. As time normally has its way the group ended up dissolving somewhat as existing members concentrated on jobs and



other life matters and new members started to express their interests not only in music but

also introducing drama and plays to the wider Slovenian community. Joining us at this time where Vlado Kunstelj, Ratko Lavter and Ivan Kozelj. The biggest dances were held at Paddington Town Hall where we performed in front of more than 500 guests. On some occasions they had to turn people as there was limited room inside..

Around 1960 or 1961 I was asked to play my accordian with my Slovenian national costume for the show "Captain Fortune" on the TV. As I didn't own a costume, Mr. & Mrs. Lajovic kindly loan theirs. It was a proud moment for me to wear this as the costume was at that time approximately 100 years old which was handmade including the cap. In the show I was asked to explain its origins and what it means to the Slovenian community during the interview.

It was in 1962 that we ended up selling the house in Redfern, as each family ended up buying their own houses, we had decided to move to Randwick. I was now working in the office at Foster Clark Foods plus two hours at night at the Rachel Foster hospital and all the extra money I earned as a musician, went towards the repayment of the loan for the new house.

Later in 1962, I met my future husband Bill Zizek at Woollahra at one of our musical practice sessions where he brought a young man to join the group who played the guitar. We got engaged on my 18th birthday. Bill and I ended up joining the drama group at Paddington church hall where we performed in stage plays. After the performance Ivan Kozelj, Vlado Kunstelj and I played for the dance.

In August 1966, I started a new job with the European Immigration ICEM as an interpreter and assistant to the liaison officer, which had extra long hours, as we had to meet all the planes and ships to process migrants on arrivals. This affected all my other joys and I had to give up all my activities with the drama group and band as I also worked on weekends.

On 26th November 1966 I got married to Bill Zizek at the St.Patrick Church Paddington by Father Valerian. Mr.Klakovcar and singers gave us a surprise at church by singing at our wedding as a thank you for all the times I accompanied them. So my father invited them all with their wife's to come to the reception at Randwick Town Hall.



In January 1970, I gave up the job at immigration as I was expecting our first child.

Lolita Evelyn Zizek was born on 29th April 1970 who was christened in the old church St.Rafaels in Merrylands by Father Valerian. Our second child Karin Sonja Zizek was born on 12th December 1972 and christened on 13th January 1973 which was the same day of the blessing of the new church by Bishop

Lenic who asked if he could perform the rite as he hasn't done one for a long time and father Valerian assisted him.

As Lolita and Karin started slovenian school at the church and also Lolita was preparing for holy communion, I was asked by sister Miriam if I could assist her with teaching the very young one's with slovenian lessons at least until they would get another sister from Slovenia. So I helped anyway I could with other work that was needed while both Karin and Lolita were preparing for their communion and confirmation. By this time they were also part of the Bankstown Little Atheletic and Revesby Workers senior clubs. Now our time was limited with all the training and competitions, plus school. This went on for 11 years.

With both excelling in athletics at state level plus Lolita being a member on the National and International side, winning and breaking the record in the u14 90m hurdles in Brisbane. Lolita also represented as a young Slovenian from Australia in Young Slovenia Sport persons from overseas and was sponsored by the Slovene Association Sydney, Triglav Club Sydney and Triglav Club Canberra so that she could attend the meeting. Due to the Chernobyl disaster and risk of radiation fallout there were many other athletes that withdrew from the events and thus she was then the only one from overseas competing in a few meetings that still continued but was not allowed to be in the finals as she didn't reside in Slovenia for a minimum of 6 months. Unfortunately she wasn't given any recognition apart from which was written in the local papers.

Later in her years she also represented Australia in the tri nation competition in Japan with China where she came home with the silver medal in the 100m hurdles, but unfortunately she missed out on the Commonwealth Games trial selections which was a shame as she was a threat to Glynis Nunn after she tore her hamstring which officially ended her career as an athlete. Lolita then chose a job in the Travel industry. When both Lolita and Karin turned 18 they helped and assisted in the Slovene Association Sydney as bar and kitchen personnel. They both belonged to the dancing group and joined the drama group as well, when time permitted.

In 1993, I joined the Slovene Association Sydney committee, where later I had to take over the secretary position. In the new committee I took on the treasurer position and had to learn computer skills, recording and analysing poker machine data, membership and managing money plus a hundred of other things that I didn't realise was involved in running of the club, but found it a very rewarding and challenging experience whilst meeting new friends. For all the years till now I was lucky to have a very good committee with me and we worked well together with each person teaching and contributing new things or introducing a better way of performing the job functions. When time permitted I also organized a variety of bus trips for the day. I still like to help when possible or if they require my assistance, but find that I wouldn't be able to go back to the committee as I see that the new rules and regulation makes it impossible to run the club without young persons or at least professional or business personnel.

NSW Slovenian Australian Awards 2008 – Outstanding Volunteer of the Year Presented on 21 June 2009



Erika Žižek was born in Prekmurje, Slovenia. At seven years of age, she was given her first small piano accordion, enrolled in music school, and her lifelong love of music had begun. Eventually, with a 120 bass accordian, she joined the Maribor orchestra. At eleven years of age, she performed with the youth orchestra in Belgrade for the President of Yugoslavia Marshall Tito's birthday. She also visited Tito's private zoo.

On 7th July 1957 her family escaped to Austria and was sent to Jannesdorf Migrant Camp. The family sailed to Australia aboard the ship Aurelia and arrived in November 1957. During the sea journey,

Erika entertained passengers and staff with her lively tunes from her home country. From Bonegilla, the family was sent to Wollongong and later went to live at Redfern. In 1966 she married Bill. They have two daughters, Lolita and Karin.

Erika went to St. Patrick's School for girls and, with the help of a nun teacher, had extra lessons in English and learnt shorthand and typing. She also worked evenings wiping dishes. During this time, Erika met Mr. Otto Weis, who was a piano accordion teacher. Under his guidance and tuition, she joined his orchestra and performed at many venues; including the Bobby Limb TV show. Erika joined the first Slovenian music group in Sydney, established by Fathers Odilo Hajnsek and Bernard Ambrozic,

to play at dances and concerts at Paddington Town Hall, which often attracted more than 500 guests. She also joined the newly formed Slovenian drama group. In the early sixties, Erika played the accordion on the television show "Captain Fortune" wearing a borrowed, 100 years old Slovenian national costume. How proud she was explaining to viewers its origin and what it meant to the Slovenian community!



Erika had worked at several different jobs, but the most important and also most demanding was the job with the European Immigration office (ICEM) as an interpreter and assistant to the liaison officer.

Erika joined the Slovene Association Sydney in 1993 as a committee member and soon became its secretary, a demanding job, yet the one she did with great diligence and love and which she found most rewarding and challenging.





Slovenian Outstanding Volunteer of the Year 2009 - Newcastle



Ladislava ali Slavica Hozjan, rojena Antolin, se je rodila 26. junija 1926 v Odrancih v Prekmurju, Slovenija, kjer je končala osem razredov osnovne šole. Rano je izgubila mater. Takoj po drugi svetovni vojni, 27. januarja 1949, se je poročila z Ivanom Hozjan. Živela sta na domu pri mačehi. Že v lagerju Greta jih je potujoči slovenski duhovnik, gospod dr. Ivan Mikula, seznanil o slovenskih mašah v 50 kilometrov oddaljenem Newcastlu. Slavica se je prve slovenske maše udeležila, ko sta s prijateljico šli z vlakom v Newcastle.

Ko se je družina preselila v Newcastle, in ko je 1958. leta začelo delovati Slovensko društvo Newcastle, sta z možem kaj hitro postala njegova člana. Ker društvo ni imelo svojih prostorov, se je veliko kuhanja opravilo doma in Slavica je bila vedno med prvimi. Žela je posebno priznanje vseh za pripravo ocvrtega kokošjega mesa. Tudi za pripravo solat je bila vedno odlična. Rada je pripravila predvsem prekmurske sladke špecialitete.

Slavica je vedno rada prihajala k slovenskim mašam. In še danes vedno pride. Že dolga leta se rojaki v Newcastlu po maši zberemo v sosednji dvorani na čajanki, kjer poklepetamo, izmenjamo novice in od časa do časa še kako zapojemo. Moški pripravijo mize in stole, ženske poskrbijo, da so mize lepo pogrnjene in napoljene z okusnimi dobrotami. Slavica je vedno ena tistih, ki poskrbi, da so na mizi beli prti. Že nekaj let nazaj je iz lastnega žepa kupila prte, da so enaki, ker preje je bil vsak prt drugačen. Tudi lončke in šalčke za kavo in čaj je preskrbela.

Težko je primerjati delo posameznika v manjši skupnosti s tistimi, kjer živi več tisoč rojakov, vendar vsaka malenkost je važna, ker pomaga, da se rojaki lahko srečujejo redno. NSW Slovenian Australian Awards 2008 –Outstanding Volunteer of the Year Presented on 21 June 2009



Ladislava or Slavica Hozjan was born in Prekmurje, Slovenia. She married Ivan Hozjan in 1946 when the times just after the World War II were harsh, it was hard to get a job and the earnings were poor.

In October 1956, with four young children in tow, the family crossed the border into Austria. They were sent to the migrant camp at Asten, near Lienz. On 9 June 1957, they arrived in Sydney on the ship Flaminia and were sent to Greta Camp. Ivan got a job at the steelworks in Newcastle. Two years later, the family moved to Newcastle and settled at Wallsend where one more daughter was born.

Slavica worked for many years at different jobs: as a cleaner, a cook, a labourer at steelworks and in a chicken factory, and for a number of years in the nearby vineyards pruning vines and picking grapes to supplement the family income.

In 1958, the Austral Slovenian Society »Tivoli« Newcastle was established. Slavica and her husband became members and started their long association with the Slovenian community. Slavica would help in the kitchen or wherever help was needed. Because the Slovenian Society »Tivoli« never had its own premises, most of the cooking had to be done at home and was brought in. Slavica was always first to help. Her Wiener schnitzels, salads and special homemade cakes were always a specialty.

Slavica regularly comes to Slovenian church services. After the service, all go to the hall next door for cake and a cup of tea. This is an opportunity to chat with friends,

exchange news and from time to time sing a song. Ladies bring goodies from home and set the tables for all to enjoy. For years now, Slavica has been ensuring there are clean tablecloths on the tables. She was also bringing cups and mugs.

In a small community such as in Newcastle, it is important to appreciate the work of each individual, small or big. This is what keeps it together. Slavica has always helped to keep the Slovenian community in Newcastle together.
