NOTIFICATION OF DETERMINATION OF DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION

Pursuant to section 92 of the Act notice is hereby given of the determination by Council of the City of Fairfield of the development application No.157/83 relating to the land described as follows:-

Lot A, D.P.372894, Bibby's Road, St. Johns Park.

Proposed Development:- Construction of Carpark associated with the existing Club Building.

The development application has been determined by the granting of consent subject to the conditions specified in this notice.

The conditions of consent are set out as follows:-

- 1. The carparking layout and landscaping to be in accordance with the plans as amended in red.
- All internal driveways to be marked with arrows to indicate direction of travel.
- Driveways and carparking areas shall be suitably constructed, sealed and drained to Council's standard specifications.
- 4. One hundred & thirty (130) carparking spaces in accordance with Council's code for off-street parking shall be provided. Each space shall be permanently marked.
- 5. All landscaped and grassed areas shall be separated from adjacent driveways and parking areas by means of a 150mm high kerb wall or other approved device to prevent vehicular movement thereon.
- Staff, company and visitors vehicles shall be parked in the spaces provided on the subject premises and not on adjacent footway or landscaping areas.

12. Compliance with the additional condition contained in the extension of development approval issued on the 24th September, 1976 in relation to the development of the site i.e.

"Construction of half width of Bibby's Road to Council's standard specification for residential roads for the full frontage of the premises. This work shall be carried out at no cost to Council".

13. The club building shall not be occupied until the carpark has been constructed in accordance with the conditions of this approval, and the conditions of development consent dated 14th August, 1975, and the extension of consent issued on the 24th September, 1976, have been complied with.

Note: Failure to comply with this requirement may result in Council instituting legal action to enforce compliance.

The reasons for the imposition of the conditions are set out as follows:-

- i. To ensure compliance with the requirements of Council and statutory authorities.
- ii. To ensure that the existing and likely future amenity of the neighbourhood is protected.
- iii. In the public interest.
 - iv. To ensure that adequate provision is made for the landscaping of the land.
 - v. To ensure that the means of entrance to and exit from the site is satisfactory.

vi. To ensure that adequate provision is made for the loading, unloading, manoeuvring and parking of vehicles on the land.

Note: Section 97 of the Act confers on an applicant who is dissatisfied with the determination of a consent authority a right of appeal to the Land and Environment Court exercisable within 12 months after receipt of this notice.

You advise that 'some work has been carried out' to the car park area however, in this regard, the actual work undertaken is required to be elaborated.

Also, the consent dated 15th September, 1983 required, inter alia;

"Submission of the following details, and approval by Council prior to commencement of work:-

- a. Internal drainage details including pipe sizes, discharge points, natural and finished surface levels, invert levels of pipes and stormwater calculations.
- Details of stormwater disposal to Council's stormwater system.
- c. Existing and design contours over the whole site. Council's Subdivision Section should be contacted in regard to these details.

It is considered the situation is unsatisfactory given the time which has elapsed subsequent to issue of approvals and should the club continue to operate outside the guidelines stipulated, Council will have little alternative than to commence legal action in relation to non compliance with Development consent conditions.

You are again requested therefore, to submit to Council a work programme with a view to full compliance with Council requirements to include roadworks, kerb and gutter, drainage, access, car park, landscaping etc.

Grants are now available to assist sporting and recreational organisations to develop sporting and recreational facilities.

Application forms have been received by Council and are available for distribution to interested clubs and organisations.

Organisations seeking assistance under the Capital Assistance Programme should ensure that an application form is completed and forwarded to Fairfield Council on or before Friday 15th November, 1985.

Council in turn is required to consider all community applications and provide a local priority rating, to assist the Department in determining State priorities.

Eligible Projects

The following information is provided as a guide to the types of projects which may attract assistance:-

- * In general, a minimum of fifty percent of the total cost of the project will need to be raised by the local organisation concerned.
- * Requests for retrospective funding, maintenance costs, running costs equipment will NOT be considered.
- * Projects which are private commercial ventures will also NOT be considered.

- * Priority will be given to areas where need is greatest.
- * Generally, high priority will be given to projects:-
 - (i) where multi-purpose or flexible usage is planned;
 - (ii) which will be used by a wide cross-section of the community;
 - (iii) which are developing in response to expressed or obvious local needs;
 - (iv) which are supported by Local Government and the community;
 - (v) where local funds will be involved; and
 - (vi) where suitable long-term management arrangements have been devised.

* Low Priority will be given if:-

- (i) the facilities duplicate others in the area that are not fully utilised;
- (ii) projects are entirely related to fencing or roadworks;
- (iii) projects are to be developed on privately owned land;
- (iv) construction work is unable to be commenced prior to 30th October, 1986.






SUMMARY

Consent was issued in 1975, for erection of a club subject to compliance with conditions, one of which required construction of an off street parking area (indicated on plan) which accompanied the development application.

The club premises have been operating without the car park facilities for some time, however other requirements such as half width road construction, kerb and gutter construction, landscaping, suitable access, etc. are unsatisfactory and in this regard, the club has been requested to proceed with work to comply.

To date, little change has taken place to the development and the club is continuing to operate.

It is the recommendation of this report that injunction proceedings be instigated in respect of the outstanding consent conditions.

REPORT BY DEVELOPMENT CONTROL OFFICER, MR. K. COLLINS

Approval was issued to develop the site for club premises in 1975 with conditions of consent requiring, inter alia, the following:-

- a. The driveways and carparking areas are to be suitably constructed, sealed and drained to Council's Chief Engineer's requirements.
- b. Landscaped areas shall be separated from driveways and car parking areas by means of a 150mm high kerb wall. All landscaping shall be maintained to the satisfaction of Council. Expanses of car parking areas shall be broken up wherever possible by landscaping strips.

In September, 1976 an extension to the development approval was granted subject to compliance with requirements of the 1975 consent and subject to the following:-

"Construction of half width of Bibby's Road to Council's standard specification for residential roads for the full frontage of the premises. This work shall be carried out at no cost to Council."

In relation to the requirements for provision of a parking area, a further development consent was issued in September, 1983.

This approval was required due to the alteration to size and location of the building, when the club was finally erected.

Subsequently, the club has continued to operate without compliance with conditions of the original consent, as well as the most recent consent (for construction of the carpark).

The club has been advised of its obligation to comply with the consent conditions, the only response being;

"We would like to notify you that some work has been carried out and is still in progress".

In response to this advice, it was requested that details be supplied of actual work 'carried out' and for a programme aimed at full compliance, to be referred to Council.

This request was made in August, 1985. To date there has been no response to the request and it is noted no work is currently in progress and little change has been effected.


